There are two options for adding songs to your SwiMP3; a) utilizing the SwiMP3 Media Manager that must installed from the included CD, or b) dragging and dropping files directly to your SwiMP3, which requires no installation. For users who need to create MP3's, it is recommended to install the SwiMP3 Media Manager. A step-by-step guide to create MP3's may be accessed from the Readme file located on the installation CD. For users who already have a MP3 collection, it is recommended to utilize the drag and drop method by following the steps below.

### HOW TO CONNECT TO YOUR COMPUTER and CHARGING

NEXT ON OTT VOL-

- Make sure your MP3 player is off and dry (not wet from swimming). Plug round end of USB connector into the MP3 player.
- 2. Plug the flat USB end of the connector into your computer's USB port (The USB port may be in the front or back of your computer).

#### CHARGING

- When the battery life is low, the green light will begin to flash. There may also be a noticeable difference in the music volume.
- 2. Remember to dry the USB socket before charging. Open USB cap to dry internal components.
- $\pmb{\textbf{3.}}$  To charge, simply plug it into the USB port on your computer as described above.
- a. When the MP3 player is plugged in, the red light will start blinking quickly; once the battery is full the blinking rate will slow down.
- **b.** The MP3 player will take two hours to fully charge, and will have approximately four hours of continuous play.
- c. Remember to properly disconnect your MP3 player as described in Step 4.

HOW TO PROPERLY DISCONNECT YOUR MP3 PLAYER

### HOW TO REFORMAT/RESET ) STEP THE MP3 PLAYER

#### Caution: Formatting your MP3 player will remove all songs from its memory.

1. If your MP3 player ever stops functioning properly it may need to be formatted.

### Reasons to format your MP3 player:

-You are having problems loading songs onto your player.

-The songs are jerky while playing or skip like a scratched compact disc.

### \*The MP3 player uses the file system "FAT" only and not "FAT32"

- 2. To Format your MP3 player.
- a. Turn it on
- b. Hold down PREV /VOL then hold ON / OFF.
- c. The green light will start blinking very quickly, then turn into a slow double. blink; this means the format is complete.

d. Now you can reload your MP3's back onto the player.

\*Caution: If the green light does a triple blink when the MP3 player is turned on, press NEXT/VOL+ once . The green light will blink rapidly then change to a double blink; this means the memory has been initialized. Now the MP3 player is ready for song loading.

### **Resetting Your MP3 Player:**

1. When your MP3 player malfunctions, press the RESET button (white dot above ON/OFF button) to reset your MP3 player. All current files will remain as is.

# HOW TO WEAR THE MP3 PLAYER

1. Position the SwiMP3 goggle comfortably over your eyes and pull the SwiMP3 unit to the back of your head.

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STEP

Secure the goggles by utilizing the adjustable straps on either side. Thread any excess strap back through the slot in the earpiece.

2. Position the SwiMP3 custom sound units on your temple and cheek bone, between your ears and eyes. (Do not position on your ears)

Turn on the SwiMP3 unit and adjust ear piece positioning to optimize bone vibration sound clarity.

# Creating MP3's from a CD

I. Open SwiMP3 Media Manager and insert a music CD into your computers CD-ROM drive.

2. Go to the "Tools" Menu and choose "Rip Audio CD."

3.A window will appear titled "Choose Encoding Destination.

a. Set the Format to MP3

b.You can choose where you want your MP3's to be saved by clicking the folder icon (default location is C:\My Music).

c. Note: Your "My Documents" folder is listed under "C:\Documents and Settings\[user name]\My Documents" where [user name] is your Windows login name.

d. Once you have selected these two options you can click the OK button to begin encoding your songs as MP3. A bar will appear across the bottom of your Media Manager screen that will show the encoding progress.

4. Once the encoding process is complete you can view the songs in your library by clicking any of the following icons listed under "Library."

a. Title b. Artist c. Album d. Genre e. Year f. Rating

5. Clicking any of these icons will allow you to view your library sorted by whichever icon you select. Example: if you click Artist your library can be viewed with the songs sorted by artist name.

6. To add songs to your SwiMP3 simply drag a song from the library to the "Finis SwiMP3" icon.

7. You can view the songs which are on your SwiMP3 at any time clicking on the "Finis SwiMP3" icon.

8. Once you have loaded all desired songs to the SwiMP3 you can right-click on the "Finis SwiMP3" icon and choose "Safely remove device."

9. It is now safe to unplug your SwiMP3.

## Importing Existing Files into The SwiMP3 Media Manager

I. Go to the "File" Menu and choose "Add/Rescan Tracks to the Library"

2.A window will appear titled "Add Folders."

3. Check the check box next to any folders which contain songs you wish to add to your Swimp3 Media Manager Library.

4. Once you have selected the folders of music you wish to add to your library click OK. A bar will appear across the bottom of your Media Manager screen that will show the progress.

# **Converting Non-MP3 Files into MP3 Format**

I. Open The SwiMP3 Media Manager and select the track you wish to convert.

- 2. Go to the "Tools" Menu and choose "Convert Audio Format."
- 3.A window will appear titled "Choose Encoding Destination.

a. Set the Format to MP3

b.You can choose where you want your MP3's to be saved by clicking the folder icon (default location is C:\My Music).

c. Note: Your "My Documents" folder is listed under "C:\Documents and Settings\[user name]\My Documents" where [user name] is your Windows login name.

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
